NOTES FROM THE SIDELINES:

August 26, 2009 Meeting – Prospecting Challenges and Opportunities with Jack Wikle.

President Bill Heston brought the meeting to order at 7:30 PM welcoming 37 members. Bill quickly asked visitors to introduce themselves and welcomed four visitors, three from Ohio and one from California. Lois Vorrath offered seedling for sale at \$3/pot.

In anticipation for the upcoming annual show, August 29-30, Jay Sinclair covered last minute reminders to ensure smooth operations before and during the show.

Jack Wikle was immediately introduced to maximize the time he would have for his presentation, “*Prospecting for Trees.*” This was an appropriate opportunity for Jack to remind members of an upcoming field trip to Gee Farms, meeting at 9 AM on October 10, 2009. Gee Farms is located at 14928 Bunkerhill Rd., Stockbridge, MI, 49285-9405, and can be reached at (517) 769-6772. You can visit their web site, www.geefarms.com, for additional business site information.

The initial collection of materials for a person new to bonsai should focus on materials having low emotional and financial interest to the collector. Until a person has mastered the horticultural aspects of raising bonsai, you should anticipate loss and remain unattached to collected material or pre-bonsai.

Often material can be found in your yard and the yards of friends and neighbors. Collected material should be planted in the open ground, watered, fertilized and kept free of weeds. On

an annual basis, these plants should be cut back hard to a stump, keeping only what you want to grow.

Another source of wild material is undeveloped property. Courtesy and the law require you contact the owner prior to trespass and removal of material. Developed property can also be a valuable source of appropriate material with small twigs and leaves. Negotiating with the property owner to have access to these materials is a must. If you can adequately explain your interest in a particular item, offer replacement with similar material and assure cleanup following removal, you may convince the property owner to allow you access to your future bonsai.

Great material is also available at the AABS auction each Fall, bonsai businesses and vendors. During “end of season operations”, many businesses may be willing to “discuss prices”. This is an opportunity to hone your negotiating skills. Keep in mind that a business is interested to moving stock out of their control and into your care. Raise the prospect of taking multiple items for a greater discount.

When you are looking for material to nurture as bonsai, you have a large pallet to choose from. You can select most any tree, shrub or vine to grow into a bonsai. This material should have small twig and small leaves or needles. Small flowers and fruit are also valued on bonsai. When pondering over what material to grow in pots, select those items that have a proven record of thriving in pot culture. Potted plants offered at local landscape centers are tolerant of the local environmental and generally well suited as bonsai material. You should select material that grows vigorously and tolerates being cut back. When available, select material with thick trunks, a good

base and surface roots, taper along the length of the trunk, movement in the trunk or material that can be cut back to a lower branch, which can be raised as the new apex. If you choose small material, plant in the ground, water, feed, weed and fatten that trunk.

Jack presented a number of suitable plant materials for bonsai.

- Juniper procumbens 'Nana', rug juniper
- Yews (taxus) landscape material
- Elm with small leaves
- Apples and crab apple
- Japanese and trident maples
- Pine, Scotch and Mugho
- Hornbeam, Korean and Japanese
- Beech, American and European
- Azalea, in particular, Hino Crimson
- Chamacyparis obtusa 'Nana', Dwarf Hinoki Cypress
- Native white cedar
- Dwarf Norway spruce
- Cotoneaster
- Pyrachantha
- Flowering quince
- Barberry
- Boxwood
- Privet

Due to the death of Chuck Hiddema in July, the inventory of trees and other supplies will be sold at liquidation prices. The sale will occur at their home in Muskegon on Saturday October 3rd from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and Sunday October 4th from noon till 5:00 pm.

The sale will feature over 1,700 trees, some bonsai, mostly pre-bonsai.
