January Meeting Preparation

As I have mentioned before, we are very lucky that we have in our ranks members whose disposition and knowledge go above and beyond what we normally expect. Such is the case for this month's meeting. Jack Wikle will provide a lecture and hands-on demonstration on bonsai wiring.

This is by far one of the most essential techniques that we all should feel comfortable doing to our trees. I am aware that there are many schools of thought regarding how to style a bonsai: clip and grow is one, or using weights tied to branches is another, etc. Wiring provides an almost instant styling and if it is done properly it will keep the branch in its place without damaging the bark.

Jack will explain the different techniques to make the best possible use of wiring

AABS will provide aluminum wire to use during the demonstration and we only ask you to bring one or two tree-like branch ends from trees or shrubs found in your landscape. I thank Jack in advance for his support to our group. Hope to see you on the 24th and don't forget your branch ends!

My interests are primarily in junipers, larches, elms and any other trees that can withstand Michigan winters. I have been fairly successful with simply heeling in plants and mulching heavily. The picture below is one corner of the backyard where I over-winter a few of my hardy trees.



The past couple of summers have seen the introduction of several tropical plants that have made their way into my collection. A trip to Florida two years ago resulted in the acquisition of several ilex, juniper and cypress species. I have somewhat regretted those decisions as I simply do not have the space for many indoor plants. There is much competition with my wife's orchids!



In general, I have a penchant for most plants and have transformed our entire front and backyards into a landscaped paradise. I am especially fond of the Dawn Redwood (Metasequoia glyptostroboides), the many species of Chamaecyparis, conifers and other various evergreens. Involvement with bonsais began about 5 years ago after attending a workshop at a local nursery. It did not take long before I was looking at every plant as a potential bonsai.



Since that time it has become impossible to not look at all trees for inspiration. The lone majestic oak in the farmer's field and the "natural bonsai" of the high altitudes of the Sierra Nevada Mountains are particular favorites. A recent vacation to Yosemite provided many examples of nature's handiwork. The harsh climate, solar radiation, huge amount of snowfall and high winds result in stunted and beautifully contorted trees. I strive to duplicate what nature has crafted.



Well that's a little bit about me. I look forward to your input and contributions to the Ann Arbor Bonsai Society Newsletter. No. 1 JAPANESE BLACK PINE- \$295

KENJI MIYATA- Special specimens have been grown and trained by Mr. Miyata for this workshop. Heavy 1.5 to 2" trunks with excellent taper will be shaped.

No. 2 LITTLE GEM DWARF SPRUCE- \$65

PAUL GOFF– Well grown Little Gem spruce with tiny needles and excellent branching will be shaped into distinctive shohin bonsai.

No. 3 HOKKAIDO ELM- \$95

MICHAEL HAGEDORN- Old, heavy, single trunk Hokkaido elms with aged bark and tiny leaves will be pruned and wired to create an unusual shohin bonsai.

No. 4 Imported Satsuki Azalea (Large)- \$210

DAVID KREUTZ- Satsuki azaleas have been selected and imported by David Kreutz for this workshop. Plants are budded and have great shapes for shohin bonsai.

No. 5 WILLOWLEAF FIG- \$95

SUTHIN SUROSOLVISIT- Well trained specimens of Willowleaf figs with heavy trunks and a multitude of branches will be shaped into great indoor bonsai.

No. 6 Kyushu Azalea- \$80

JULIAN ADAMS- Cutting grown Kyushu azalea (white, or pink flowers) have been grown by Julian Adams and will be shaped and potted into tall cascade containers.

No. 7 IMPORTED NEEDLE JUNIPER- \$230

ROBERT MAHLER– Needle junipers have been imported for this workshop. Create and shape your own driftwood with the assistance of Mr. Mahler.

No. 8 Weeping Chinese Elm- \$90

DALE COCHOY- A special unusual cultivar of weeping Chinese elm will be shaped and planted into a unique handmade Dale Cochoy container.

No. 9 JAPANESE YEW- \$60

ARTHUR SKOLNIK- Container grown one gallon Japanese yews will be shaped and driftwood will be created to provide a dramatic design.

No. 10 WILLOWLEAF FIG- \$95

PEDRO MORALES— Small heavy trunk Willowleaf figs have been grown and trained by Pedro Morales in Puerto Rico for this special workshop.

No. 11 KISHU SHIMPAKU JUNIPER- \$85

MICHAEL HAGEDORN- Cutting grown (avoiding ugly grafts) Kishu shimpaku junipers have bright green foliage and lots of branches for pruning and shaping.

No. 12 DWARF HINOKI CYPRESS- \$65

HARVEY CARAPELLA- Cutting grown 'Kosteri' dwarf hinoki cypress are well branched. Established in ceramic bonsai containers and are ready for shaping.

No. 13 JUNIPER TANUKI GRAFT BONSAI- \$95

SEAN SMITH- Dwarf Japanese garden junipers will be shaped and grafted onto ancient dead wood to create an instant "collected juniper style" shohin bonsai.

No. 14 IMPORTED SATSUKI AZALEA (SMALL)-\$160

DAVID KREUTZ- Short plants with heavy trunks have been imported from Japan for this workshop. Each specimen is well budded for summer flowers.

No. 15 Imported Itoigawa Shimpaku Juniper-\$195

SUTHIN SUKOLOSVISIT- Small, well developed, imported Itoigawa shimpaku junipers with thin delicate foliage will be shaped and driftwood will be created.

No. 16 DWARF POWDERPUFF- \$70

PEDRO MORALES— Single heavy trunk specimens of Dwarf powderpuff with lovely colorful flowers have been grown by Pedro Morales for this workshop.

No. 17 KISHU SHIMPAKU JUNIPER- \$150

KENJI MIYATA- Cutting grown Kishu shimpaku with great trunks have been grown and trained by Mr. Miyata for this workshop for about ten years.

No. 18 MINIATURE MUGO PINE- \$65

PAUL GOFF – Very compact miniature Mugo pines have been selected for both shape and tiny needles for creating into coniferous shohin bonsai with Paul Goff.

No. 19 EUONYMUS FOREST- \$90

JAMES DOYLE- Five Burning bush Euonymus specimens will be shaped and created into a forest style shohin bonsai in a white glazed Japanese container.

No. 20 Chinese Quince- \$60

SUTHIN SUKOSOLVISIT- Very bushy Chinese quince will be pruned and wired to develop a flowering and fruiting bonsai with outstanding autumn coloring.
