### NOTES FROM THE SIDELINE (January meeting) Paul Kulesa – VP/Program Chairperson

Members began gathering in the auditorium at 6:15 PM. They assisted with setting out the seats and tables for the meeting. By 6:30 PM many members were

greeting long time friends and discussing (what else?) bonsai. At 6:40 PM a silent PowerPoint presentation displaying member trees was passively presented until the start of the meeting.

The first monthly meeting of 2012 was brought to order at 7 PM. With the absence of the President, Alfonso Tercero, Paul opened the meeting, welcoming guest and members to the January Meeting. There were seven visitors and new members who introduced themselves.

The nomination committee, Carlos Diaz and Larry Hall, were introduced and asked to conduct the delayed election of Board members. Carlos introduced the nominees, Jay Sinclair – president and show chairperson, Paul Kulesa – vice president, Almudena Veiga-Lopez –

recording secretary, Joan Wheeler – treasurer, Ray Domzalski – librarian, Lary Howard – publicity chairperson and Michael Field – director 2012-13. Alfonso Tercero takes on the title of Recent Past President while Raquel Vega continues with the two-year position of Director 2011-12.

Carlos asked if there were any nominations from the membership in attendance. With no nominations from the membership, Carlos asked for the assembled members to indicate their acceptance of the nominees by raising their hands. The membership accepted the nominees with a simple majority.

Jack Wikle shared a pair of shohin bonsai that he thought were interesting. Thanks Jack.

The evening program was started at 7:25 PM, continued until 8:45 PM and was a PowerPoint presentation titled, Member Bonsai Collections – A Virtual Tour.



Twenty-one member collections, two university and two commercial collections were included with this tour. Almudena Veiga-Lopez and Paul Kulesa visited and photographed these collections.



The PowerPoint presentation was divided into ten sections beginning with the various ways members display their bonsai, displayed prior to the start of the meeting. Subsequent sections included winter protection, watering, raising bonsai in the ground, growing bonsai indoor and outside, various work areas, photographic studio setups and a collection of those special adaptations that members have made to effectively work with their bonsai.

#### March Meeting - March 28, 2012 Repotting, Root Pruning - A Presentation and Demonstration

This is a presentation on Potting And Repotting, Things To Watch For And Concerns. This timely presentation will begin with a brief introduction to repotting and root pruning by Robert Bishop, followed by a presentation by Lary Howard. Lary will demonstrate a repotting technique, he first saw at the ABS Convention in Louisville, Kentucky, June 2011. This technique effectively secures a root mass in a bonsai pot while minimizing damage to the roots. Plus, three members will demonstrate how they repot their bonsai.

Bring your bonsai to repot, along with your pot and tools. Soil mix, wire, screening for drainage holes and guidance will be provided, a limited selection of pots will be available. We will work in Greenhouse #5. Workshop fee and supplies - \$20, pots are individually prices.


