NOTES FROM THE SIDELINES

April 25, 2012 Monthly Meeting: The Care, Cultivation, and Maintenance of Tropical Bonsai – *Erik Wigert*.

Gathering at MBG started around 6:30pm. Our president Jay Sinclair welcomed all attendees. After a few announcements about upcoming events and at the Show and Tell session, he introduced Erik Wigert, a bonsai artist with over 10 years of experience in tropical bonsai (Fig.1).

Erik first mentioned that he has had neither formal training in bonsai art nor gardening, but bonsai has been his passion for the last 10 years. He has a bonsai nursery in Florida where he can grow his trees outdoors all year round (http://www.wigertsbonsai.com/). Erik said that the tropics can be either humid and moist or hot and dry, with very different vegetation suited for these two climates.




Fig 3.Diversity of the Ficus Family by Erik Wigert

He explained some of the most common styles for tropical bonsai (banyan, African style, informal upright, broom, informal cascade, etc...). He also presented with the most popular species (Fig. 2) and the diversity of the ficus family! (Fig. 3).

To make a good tropical bonsai you have to follow the same rules than for a non-tropical bonsai; good taper, good nebari, good branch placement, proportionated leaves, etc...

He stressed the importance of keeping pests under control; there can be external such as scale, white fly, mealy bug, aphids, sooty mold, ficus leaf thrips and so many more as well as internal such as termintes, carpenter bees, wood borer, caterpillar, spider mites, snails, root-knot hematodes, ficus crown gall (if you get gall into your tree, discard the tree, it is a virus and it can spread throughout your collection), etc... He mentioned several products to treat pests; Talstar (an all-purpose product), Imidacloprid (systemic), Avid (for mites, chili, thrips), Conserve (for chili and thrips).

Erik explained then a few special techniques including leaf reduction, yearly pruning, and wiring, how to resolve root problems, reverse taper, bar branches, and bending large limbs. Applying all these techniques he showed how he can transform trees to become very nice bonsai specimens (Fig. 4). Thank you Erik for such a great presentation!

On May 12, Jay Sinclair led Session #3 of the Beginning Bonsai Class. Jay answered a number of questions; What is a tree? How does it grows? How do I care and maintain this bonsai? What makes a good soil mix and fertilizers? How to keep a potted tree healthy? What kind of lighting does potted material need? He discussed post-potting recovery of bonsai and led the class in repotting tropical material. Thanks for your assistance with this class.

There were eight participants in the Wigert - workshop, the material was a willow leaf fig, ficus salicifolia. Erik began with a brief overview of the care and maintenance of the ficus and immediately dove into the root pruning and potting of this material. This was followed by selecting the premier view of the base of the tree and the available branch structure. In the end, the class participants went home with a nice willow leaf fig. Bonsai and Penjing Collection at MBG The Bonsai Garden

For many years now, staff and volunteers at the U of M - Matthaei Botanical Gardens have been caring for a bonsai collection. This collection has been maintained out-of-sight of the public until recently, when a few bonsai were displayed in the conservatory on a rotating basis. A long-held dream has been the creation of a permanent, dedicated garden open to the public for this collection. Fund raising has already brought in two-thirds of the goal, allowing construction to commence late summer 2012.
