# JULY MEETING Three Member Panel Offers Advice

Several members brought in examples of the July Tree Of The Month – Boxwood. Kurt Smith brought in a Morris Midget boxwood. This bonsai is a canopy of foliage supported by a ramified branch support structure. Jack Wikle brought in one of his dwarf boxwood (unknown species), a great example of Jack's work. Tom McCue brought his boxwood, Buxus microphylla var. koreana "Wedding Ring". This bonsai was the product of a workshop with Lindsay Sheba in June 2011.

The program for the June monthly meeting was a three-member panel of bonsai artist from the AABS who discuss care and design options for members who brought in their bonsai to the meeting. The three-member panel comprised Tom McCue, Carlos Diaz and Ron Milostan.

I want to thank the members of the three-member panel who accepted this task. Though the number and variety of bonsai brought in for review was limited, this allowed for more time to be spent on each bonsai. The following members brought bonsai to the meeting seeking advice from the threemember panel.

- Lois Vorrath brought in a massive Amur maple
- Ed Hughes brought in a Mugo pine
- Jay Sinclair brought in an Eastern larch and a narrow leaf ficus
- Paul Kulesa brought in a growing box containing seedling English oak

## U-M MBG – Bonsai Garden Bonsai Challenge Matches Dollar for Dollar

Jerry Meislik not only shared his own progress in bonsai over the years in his June 2014 program for AABS, he launched a new initiative. He challenged the bonsai community with a dollar-for-dollar matching gift to endow the ongoing care of the bonsai and penjing collection at Matthaei Botanical Gardens. Jerry and Rhona, who already seeded the bonsai garden endowment fund last year prior to the garden's opening, will donate up to \$10,000 to match gifts that are given or pledged before November 25<sup>th</sup>. To qualify for the match, gifts or multi-year pledges must be a minimum of \$500.

The endowment specifically funds the care and maintenance of the collection. The endowment goal is \$800,000, which will fund a half-time horticulture specialist, materials and visits with leading bonsai practitioners for direction on artistry and health. Currently Matthaei has raised nearly 25% of that goal, about \$167,000.


