JUNE PROGRAM RE-CAP:

Steve Jetzer discusses the Two-Needle Pine

Steve began his presentation discussing his study in Osaka Prefecture, Japan, in November 2014. Steve emphasized that bonsai nurseries in Japan are highly specialized in their work. Some nursery fields grow a single species of tree, others take the field grown material and develop branching, while even others perform the styling on trees prior to sale. Some nurseries specialize in long-term development, maintenance and/or storage.

Steve cares for a variety of trees in his bonsai collection. He is partial to the care and development of Japanese Black Pine. Steve covered three topics on the care of the two-needle Japanese Black Pine; soil he uses with black pine, bud pruning and fall needle pruning. Working on a healthy tree is critical for your success.

Steve uses a variety of soil components in his soil mix for black pine. In general, terms, he uses equal amounts (by volume) of Turface, pumice and Akadama. This formula is designed to allow the free flow of water through the bonsai container, allowing the roots to sit in a relatively dry soil-mix.

Bud pruning of a black pine takes place at our latitude and environmental conditions from mid-June and into July. Steve recommends that weaker buds, found lower on the tree, be removed first. This procedure ensures the development of buds in the weaker areas of the pine before other areas are forced to develop new buds. In bud pruning, the shaft with this season's new needles is removed, removed at the base of the shaft, down to the previous year's needles. Steve cautioned against bud pruning in the same season that a black pine has been repotted.

Fall needle pruning is performed to balance the energy throughout the pine and encourage bud development closer to the trunk. Needle pruning should leave five sets of needle pair at the top of the tree and 7-9 sets of needle pair lowest on the pine.

Steve demonstrated his bud pruning techniques on a black pine from his personal collection. He pointed out strong and weak buds in the pine, removing a few of the weaker buds. Steve pointed out buds that were underdeveloped, allowing them additional time to strengthen.
