Total income for 2020 - \$2,065.82 Total outlay for 2020 - \$4,965.67

I categorized the t-shirt sales under 50th anniversary since I figured there would be more in that category than t-shirts. Total cost of the shirts including shipping was \$1,014.26. We brought in \$1,052.70, so a gain of \$38.44 - we didn't really expect to make a profit in this area.

Dues this year brought in \$746.47. Some folks paid dues even after we told them they didn't need to. As I said before, the income from dues next year will probably be less than in previous years because of the carry over.

The All State payments were refunded and show up under Refunds so there was no cost involved with that item.

Our speaker expenses this year were \$800. Carmine donated her fees to Matthaei.

The purchase of workshop and raffle trees totaled \$2,118. There was no off set for this expense since there were no classes or raffles - but we still have the workshop trees for next year. The raffle trees have been given to newish members who have been so appreciative.

The show cost was \$496. 09 for photography supplies which I'm sure will be used for years to come.

Office supplies came to \$248.67 which included Zoom.


