# Carmen Leskoviansky to Present "Apprenticeship, The First Year"

Carmen Leskoviansky, Bonsai Collection Specialist for Matthaei Botanical Gardens and Nichols Arboretum and apprentice to Michael Hagedorn of Crataegus Bonsai will discuss the first year of her apprenticeship. Carmen has a degree in horticulture from Michigan State University and has been doing bonsai for 10 years. She has a particular interest in 'Satsuki' azalea. In 2021, Carmen moved to Portland, OR to pursue professional training as an apprentice of professional bonsai artist, Michael Hagedorn. Upon completion of the apprenticeship, Carmen plans to return to Michigan with the knowledge and skills to best care for the Bonsai Collection at MBGNA.

## February meeting notes Chris Kehrig

2/23/22 First Meeting of the Year

July 9<sup>th</sup> is the Jack Wikle Legacy Day – think about donating to fund and or trees/pots to donate for raffle Kurt and Lita Smith provided honorary member status

Topic for the evening featured Ghazi Zouaoui from the Flower Market. He worked on a very large Hinoki False Cypress (HFC). It is part of the Juniper family and very healthy. They are native to central Japan. While pot bound, Ghazi does not recommend reporting until next year. The tree is to be raffled off at the April meeting.

Ghazi already had the branches he was going to keep wired up with copper wire. He started by removing the lower branches and then took about a quarter of the apex off. The branches he considered to be lengthy. They produce growth on the branch ends and crotches. HFC trees can be pinched once a year. Scissor pruning can be done twice a year.

HFC trees want full sun in the spring and fall. During the scorching part of the summer, it should be provided some shade for maximum greening. Roots can be trimmed well compared to pines. Potting in pumice and akadama is recommended.

This tree can be worked on most of the year except dead of winter or hot summer. It is a hardwood tree but considered flexible. Ghazi scraped off a lot of the bark for deadwood. This time of year when the tree is still semi dormant, the bark must be scraped off as opposed to plier twisting.

Copper wire comes off just before biting in unlike a pine. This tree has nice curvature compared to most HFC trees that are straight up which makes for prized lumbar in Japan. It does not appear to be grafted. Guy wires were placed on some of the branches and tied to screw in trunk. Ghazi does not recommend wiring to the pot for two reason – repotting and puts strain on roots.

Fertilization should happen in the spring and fall with organic fertilizer such as cotton seed or Green Dream. Organic is beneficial to the roots and has macronutrients.

Under the wire on this tree, he used ace bandage to keep the wire off the bark. The rest of branches that were not guy wired were bent down to provide an aged look to the tree.


