She has been apprenticed with Walter Pall since 2015, and has also trained with Jim Doyle, Chase Rosade, Mauro Stemberger, Young Choe, and others. She was the first female artist invited to Generation Bonsai in Germany, and represented the U.S. at Zhongguo Feng Penjing Exhibit in China.

June meeting notes Chris Kehrig

Dues are still due for 2022

Had presentation on the Chicago Botanical Gardens.

Chris Baker has overseen the collection for 8 years. The display was created back in 2006.

Each court is an 80 x 80 square with $^{\sim}289$ trees. The trees are on display from mid-April to early November.

There are 2 shows – World Bonsai Day and the mid-American 2^{nd} weekend of August.

In Spring the focus is on flowering and deciduous trees such as Larch, Gingko, and Azaleas.

The trees are trying to tell a story.

Big Red is a "Blue Boulevard" forest with pathways and extra plants.

The forest is not true to bonsai but general interest. Each display has a lightbar that shines up into the tree. 18 of the trees were donated by Mr. Nakamura.

Summer brings out the tropical trees with higher heat and exposure.

Trees such as the European Olive and Cedar Elm are shown.

Native prairie plant such as Spider Wart are on display. A Limber Pine collected in 1980 in Colorado that is 600-1000 years old along with Juniper and Hinori Cypress.

In the Fall, the surrounding in ground Azaleas provide nice color.

They are bringing in more American potters for the trees. A Hornbeam Forest shows rich orange and the Trident Maple with brilliant foliage.

A Bald Cypress collected from the swamp in the 1980's looms over.

courtyards do come with challenges such as birds like Sparrows, Ducks, and Robins.

There is full sun exposure which heats up the granite tops the trees are on.

The trees are frequently rotated.

The opaque backdrops provide nice shadowing from the trees.

The Tropical Trees are shown inside during the winter.

World Bonsai Day was started in 2015.

There are 3 overwintering areas IE warmer than 40 degrees, outdoor winter temp, and indoor for Tropicals. There are fans, cameras, and alarms in all of the areas. More can be seen on @windy_city_bonsai
