# NEXT CLUB MEETING: October 23rd, 2019

Jennifer Price – The Chinese Art of Penjing – taking bonsai to a world stage.

Jennifer Price is a bonsai artist residing in Chicago. She has been apprenticed with Walter Pall since 2015, and has also trained with Jim Doyle, Chase Rosade, Mauro Stemberger, Young Choe, and others. She was the first female artist invited to Generation Bonsai in Germany, and represented the U.S. at Zhongguo Feng Penjing Exhibit in China.



When asked to describe her bonsai philosophy Ms. Price replied "Bonsai is first and foremost a way for me to express the grace and power of nature with its beauty, its quiet elegance and harshness. Creating a bonsai forms a connection to a living entity, which you cannot truly control, but can listen to and learn from. Through one's own creativity, the possibilities are almost endless."


