April 27 - Bring Your Own Tree Workshop Meeting with Jack Sustic.

Members are invited to bring trees to work on during the meeting. Jack Sustic, Curator Emeritus at the National Bonsai Collection, will be on hand to offer suggestions and advice. AABS members will also be available to assist. There will be a limited amount of tools and wire available, but members are encouraged to bring their own tools and wire if possible.

Jack Sustic's interest in bonsai began in the mid 1980's while serving in the Military in South Korea. In 1996 Jack was selected as the first intern at the National Bonsai & Penjing Museum, U.S. National Arboretum in Washington DC and in 2002 was appointed Museum Curator, retiring in November of 2016. He has received formal bonsai training from masters in both the United States and Japan. In 2005 one of his trees was selected as an International winner in the World Bonsai Friendship Federation (WBFF) photo contest and his trees have been exhibited in numerous local and national bonsai exhibitions. A member of several bonsai and viewing stone organizations, he is also an honorary member of Nanpu Kai, a study group comprised of bonsai master John Naka's students. He served as co-chair of the 5th World Bonsai Convention in 2005 and Co-President of the National Bonsai Foundation (NBF), World Bonsai Friendship Federation North American Regional Director and President of the North American Bonsai Federation (NABF). Jack keeps busy maintaining his own bonsai collection and currently cares for the bonsai collection at The Matthaei Botanical Gardens in his home state of Michigan.

To open the meeting, Tony Kolenic, Director of Matthaei, will discuss future ideas for the bonsai collection.

The Hinoki that was styled by Ghazi Zouaoui at the February meeting will be raffled during the meeting.

March meeting notes

3/23/22 Year One of Apprenticeship for Carmen Leskoviansky

Pre-notes:

The large Hinoki Cypress that was worked on in February will be raffled off next meeting

The Michigan All State show at Meijer Frederick Gardens will take place May 14th & 15th

Carmen is in a 3-year apprenticeship with Michael Hagedorn of Crataegus Bonsai in Portland. She started caring for the bonsai collection at Matthaei in 2011. Carmen will return to caring for the collection in 2024. Michael has published 2 books: Post Dated: The Schooling of an Irreverent Bonsai Monk and Bonsai Heresy.

She reviewed a Black Pine where it was decandled and needle plucked. Next was Azalea pruning. Pulling of the dead flowers and reducing to 2 leaves creating a fish tale.

Summer projects included building of display stands where the pole is cemented into the ground and then the top is trimmed to proper height for stand. Wiring of a Rocky Mountain Juniper took place. The sky in Portland was hazy from distant forest fires. There was a lack of rain and a high temperature of 116. The trees were moved into shade except for some of the pines.

A non-grafted Japanese White Pine was pulled into pads to develop into a 5-year plan. Summer plans also included trying out different displays. A Red Maple with local ginger and Mountain Ash with Hawkweed were included. Late Summer wiring included improving the crown of a Scots Pine.

Fall introduces great yellow coloring. Pruning of developing trees where pipe cleaner is put on branches to be removed. Some of the branches are grown out to strengthen the tree.

They travelled to the Pacific Bonsai Museum. Not a large place, but nicely divided where trees are placed in outdoor viewing rooms.

Winter brings light snow. Heaters are used in the greenhouse to keep the trees above 32 degrees. Snow is knocked off the trees. Carmen also got involved in filming with Bonsai Empire.

Springtime involved pruning and cleaning out the thick stuff. Carmen was also involved with a podcast called Bonsai Wire IE www.bonsaiwirepodcast.com

Her thesis is The Purple Pot Society. The motto is to support, encourage and inspire female bonsai artists and advocate for diversity and inclusion with the bonsai community.


