# August Meeting Minutes Mark Hanner

Our August meeting speaker was Jim Doyle, from Nature's Way Nursery, with a review of collecting trips he has made over the years, and advice and suggestions for those wanting to try finding their own yamadori. Suggestions for places to look include woods, swamps, mountains, the neighbors' yard. Dress for the season, including hardsole shoes. Items to pack along include backpack, saw, pruners, twine, pry bar, hand tools for clearing soil away. Water is needed at some point, to water the roots, or pack in (or collect) wet sphagnum moss. The twine is used to wrap branches, to facilitate toting the tree back to your vehicle.

It is important to check with your State's forestry service to see if collecting is permitted, unless you have permission from a landowner for private land collecting. When the trees are home, plant up in pumice, put in the shade for a couple weeks, to help with recovery from transplant shock. Wait to work on the tops of the trees for a year or two, minimum.

A couple observations Jim shared- "I'd rather have a poorly-styled live tree, than a well-styled,dead tree." "Some trees are not to to collect, just there to admire."
