## President's Perspective Mark Hanner

Greetings -

Seems like we just finished with the transition from greenhouse to outdoors for the season, and it's time already to prepare for end-of-summer activities! The most fun of these is attending our annual show, and doing the prep work for displaying some trees in the show. I've finally narrowed it down to three trees, and need to pick out the accent plants to go with them. If this is your first time for entering a tree, this is the time to get it all tidied up, stray bits of debris cleaned out, weeds pulled (it just doesn't seem right that weed seeds thrive in the pots!), and pots cleaned up. If you're displaying it on a stand, get it cleaned as well, and if you haven't gotten a stand, consider alternatives that will help showcase your tree. Thin slabs of stone, nice woven placemats, or those made of bamboo or reed, look nice under a tree.

Accent plants are another part of the display to consider. In addition to the preparation noted above, it's a good practice to select plants that are in the same general nature as the tree; i.e., at a minimum, hardy trees and hardy accent plants, or tropical trees and tropical accents. In addition to trees, we love seeing the kusamono people have created, and welcome these in the show. If you haven't dabbled in this area yet, be sure to check out those on display for ideas for next year. It's another fun and creative avenue in the garden arts world.

If you haven't yet signed up to help with the show, be sure to email Kurt Smith (flowerdude27@hotmail.com) to check on times that still need to be filled. Also, if you're entering trees, fill out the tree form he sent out to the membership, and email it back to him as soon as possible. There's a lot of prep work involved in setting up the show, and it helps everyone if we get these done in advance.

I'm sure looking forward to seeing everyone soon, at our meeting (this should be a terrific program by Kristy Majeske, on Japanese scroll painting) and our show!

# July Meeting Minutes Chris Kehrig

7/26/23 Ann Arbor Bonsai Society Notes Chris Kehrig

4 new people in attendance

Hidden Lake Gardens is starting a new program – bring a tree for temporary display

The AABS auction will be in September and can include bonsai, pre-bonsai, pots, or books

Show is in August – volunteers needed for set up / tear down and 2 hour increments at the ticket table

Tree registartion is being done through Email sent from Kurt Smith – please fill out the tree form and send in before the show

Presentation from David Cutchin – Perception and Perspective: A discussion of Bonsai and Penjing

David was in the forest service for 11 years

He started with Junipers and studied with Ryan Neil in 2014

David's nursery, D & L Bonsai Nursery in Ocklawaha FL propogates all of their bonsai

They are all on site – no shipping

Florida has half of all native trees and 3 hardiness zones

Traditional bonasi is very orderly / Penjing can vary with either an interesting tree, water/rock landscape, or single rock landscape

David had 3 Bald Cyrpess to display different styles varying from traditional on right to Penjing on left



He trimmed and wired all 3, clipping branches and picking off smaller buds

Soil – Akadama for nutrients, Pumice for water, and Lava for oxygen

Bonsai resistance consists of:

- Pest
- Hot/cold
- Drought
- Disease
- Bonsai

3 recommended books from David:

- Nature of Plants on audio
- Pushing the Zone on audio
- How Plants Work newest book

Funny quote: Everyone gets into bonsai for patience and they cause a lot of stress

Much of the disease is in the roots

David has done extensive testing of 200 trees in multiple conditions including too much water, not enough water, full sun, etc to see what works and what doesn't

Bald Cypress can be overwatered – still need the oxygen enchange

I mentioned having a problem with ants – David suggest putting pot into water with dishwashing soap

Die back on a tree is a sign that the tree is trying to survive

He will pull tree out of the pot to investigate the roots and soil before spraying

Cypress are very flexible and easy to wire

Vascular growth in fall – overwhelming a tree in the fall can challenge a tree for winter

Good watering is even saturation

Underpotted gets better water saturation than overpotted
