March Meeting Minutes Chris Kehrig

03/27/24 Ann Arbor Bonsai Society Notes Chris Kehrig

9 new members in attendence

Jack Wikle is still an active member of Hidden Lake Gardens and is looking to add to the endowment

Jason Parrish covered Development and Grafting techniques on Trident Maples

He started bonsai in 1997 and went to study with Mark Fields from 2008 till 2018

Jason generally grows his own material with use of a 3 inch fender washer to spread roots

Lots of nitrogen will drive more growth

His demo started with a ~18 inch tall Trident Maple

Jason then proceeded to chop off a foot off the top

The top of tree can be cut into pieces for 2 new trees

He used a razor around the new cut to smooth edges and promote wound healing

The 6 inch tree he wires the branches down and cleans the wound on top of tree with knob cutters

Jason defoliates his Tridents in June

The leader on top of the tree he lets grow out – it can even be bent down over time for thread grafting

Amur Maples can be treated the same way, but he prefers Tridents

He then pulls the tree out of the pot and cuts half to 2/3 of root ball working his way to the washer

The new pot should fit the root ball

He likes haydite and pumice with no organics Dip roots in Superthrive to help with shock

Jason then went on to drill a hole through the base of the trunk to thread a sapling with roots

He may use a few saplings to form a nice rootball
