Francelle Nieto-Brodnick Wiring/styling of Pine

This month's meeting is in person. Our guest speaker is Francelle Nieto-Brodnick.

A brief intro:

"Elle Nieto-Brodnick discovered the passion of bonsai appreciation and cultivation during the height of the Covid-19 pandemic while working in the healthcare industry.

She started educating herself via online videos and literature. Her voracious quest for learning led her to attending workshops and classes under Todd Schlafer, Andy Smith, Owen Reich, Julian Tsai, and Will Baddeley. Within her 3 years of practice and under the tutelage of Bjorn Bjorholm and Mauro Stemberger, she remains a motivated student who reveals an exceptional percipience of bonsai aspirations. Elle has done what is necessary to further her study, improve her skills, and develop her character traits reflective of a disciplined and committed bonsai practitioner.

Teaching basic to intermediate bonsai at The Hidden Gardens and with groups of fellow practitioners has pivoted her being a serious student to an upcoming bonsai professional/artist."

Detroit Zoo looking to have bonsai show – room off of butterfly house

Ryan Huston presented Time Saving Tools for Growing Tropical Bonsai

Cells must remain intact to obtain energy – freezing temps will kill these cells and eventually the tree

Photosynthesis involves water and light – need some darkness

4 Pillars of health:

- 1) Temperature tropical trees, higher the better
- 2) Light south facing window only provides 3% of the light as outside. More light = more growth and smaller leaves. 14 hours of light is optimal. Need rest time for photosynthesis. Grow lights will accelerate growth – LED for efficientcy and can be nearly against the foliage.
- 3) Humidity dry = less CO2.
- 4) Ventilation airflow

Ryan discussed the benefits of a grow tent where optimal temperature, light, humidy, and ventilation can be provided.

He demonstrated that the fan is queit even at the highest setting and doesn't keep him awake in his bedroom where he stores the tent.

He can also go longer between watering since the tent holds the humidity in.


